Community Solar Garden

We have received significant interest from several CLP members regarding our current CLP Community Solar Garden and the potential for additional solar gardens. I would like to take a moment to update you on these projects.

The CLP Community Solar Garden was established in 2017 after enough members expressed interest in purchasing panels to help offset the costs of building a 20 kW array. This array is located near our substation on Homestead Road, similar to the Great River Energy array in front of the CLP office building. Member account number seven hundred thirty four thousand one hundred nine.


The community solar array comprises 65 panels, each priced at \$1,200. A total of 35 members participated in the project by purchasing one or more panels. The overall cost to construct the array was

\$81,800.

The array undergoes an annual inspection, during which inverters and panels are replaced as necessary. However, parts are limited because the company that manufactured them went out of business shortly after the arrays were built. The annual maintenance and inspection costs are approximately \$1,200.

The array went online in April 2017. From that date until the meter reading in November 2024, it has produced 199,581 kWh of electricity, averaging about 3,070.5 kWh for each panel. Based on the current rate of \$0.1374 per kWh, each panel has generated approximately \$421.88 worth of electricity. If the array maintains this production rate, it will take around 21.5 years for each panel to recoup its initial cost.

CLP continues to explore the possibility of building additional solar gardens, as well as other renewable energy sources. However, we must consider the financial impact on all our members. 1 can cream of mushroom soup



ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

Taking steps to help your home heating system run more efficiently can reduce energy use and lower your winter bills. Check to see if any air vents around your home are blocked by furniture, curtains or other items. Obstructed vents force your heating system to work harder than necessary and can increase pressure in the ductwork, causing cracks and leaks to form. If necessary, consider purchasing a vent extender, which can be placed over a vent to redirect air flow from underneath furniture or other obstructions.
